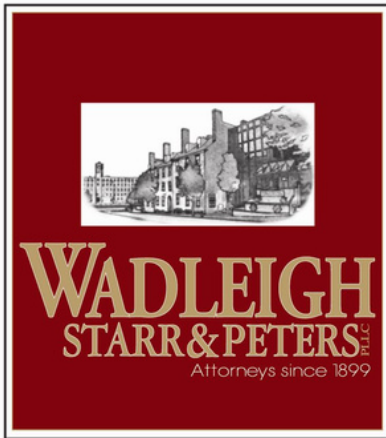

Recent Developments in Special Education Law: New State Statutes Regulating New Hampshire Public Schools.

During the legislative session concluding in June 2025, public schools were again at the center of the culture wars. Drummond Woodsum's special education team will review the new state statutes regulating public schools, with a focus on those related to special education.

Educational leaders never know how much trauma or stress students, staff, colleagues, or families may be carrying with them. They, "their brain", may be responding in a completely normal way to a completely abnormal situation from their past or present. Join Dr. Alison Roy at the 2025 Annual NHASEA Summer Conference as she works with educational leaders to take a deep dive into the neuroscience behind why humans respond the way they do to other people and the world around them. Are You Hyper or Hypo?

Our first day together will lay the groundwork for our learning, healing and growing. Take the morning to learn about how your brain, how the brains of those around you, respond to stress. Take a deep dive into the neuroscience behind why humans respond the way they do to other people and the world around them. This in depth understanding helps us to build empathy and compassion for the difficult work we do everyday. Understanding the very basics of our neurological response helps us to navigate difficult conversations better, construct creative solutions for students, and assist colleagues who are struggling all without burning out ourselves. This session starts the summer conference off with an interactive and reflective half day of learning.

Morning Session

The Science of Flocking

We have heard the volumes of research about ACES - Adverse Child Experiences - and other social determinants of health. Today is about ways we can help this generation of students heal their brains through PCEs or Positive Childhood Experiences. Research shows that the most impactful PCE is the human relationship. The morning will celebrate those relationships. Learn the science of the fourth "f" or flocking. How do we learn to connect with other humans? What role do attachment, attunement and co-regulation play in all of this? How does flocking work with students but also with adult stakeholders such as parents, colleagues, administrators or even boards?

Fostering Your Flock

Flocking is just one strategy in the PCE arsenal. The afternoon will begin to broaden the catalog of strategies that engage the thrive pathway for all stakeholders and "foster your flock." Whether you're faced with a difficult conversation or meeting with a parent or need to advise one of your teachers about best steps forward for a student, these brain based strategies will give you options, language, and the science to help difficult situations go more smoothly. Strategies include healthy boundaries, resilience training for students, fostering effective conversations, cultivating accountability and restorative justice practices.
